

To make life easier you can CAREFULLY use a pointed awl or other impliment to punch the small holes in the design if you are not used to cutting tiny circles with a craft knife. You can also simplify the design by not cutting the roof tiles or wreath. It will still look good without these.

Once you have finished cutting (if you have cut them) you can push out all the roof semi-circles slightly towards the 'best' side to create the roof tiles. Do the same with the wreath and handle on the front door.

Next fold all score lines inwards EXCEPT the roofline and the scorelines where the very bottom of the roof panels meet the walls as these create the 'eaves'.

Next flip the house over and add glue to the 'best' side of the two flaps indicated on the lantern. The four flaps on the apexes which go under the roof do not need to be glued, they are there to ensure everything tucks away neatly.

You can then stick it all together and place it over a battery tea light. Do NOT place it anywhere near a real tealight or naked flame!
